Scope and Content: A single letter (1 page, front and back) dated September 1, 1864 written by Reuben Evarts, of Bellville, Richland County, Ohio, to H. P. Davis. It contains a list of local volunteer soldiers who joined Company H of the 59th New York Infantry and various other Ohio Volunteer Infantry regiments. The list gives their full name and their regiment or company. Evarts also discusses coordinating some sort of public speaking event in Bellville with a person named "Hubble." He also asks how the "Chicago Nomination and Platform takes," likely referring to the Democratic Convention of 1864.
