Creators: Emeline Gallup (1816-1901) of Windsor County, Vermont; Theodore C. Gallup (1789-1868); unnamed member of the Richardson branch of the family, descendant of Mariah H. Gallup (1817-1872) and Lester Richardson (1805-1892).

Donor: Unknown

Biography of Creators: Emeline Gallup was born on March 6, 1816 to Theodore C. Gallup (1789-1868) and Laura Pease (1793-1865) in Hartford, Windsor County, Vermont. She and her father were descendants of John Gallup (1593-1650) and Christobel Brushett (1592-1655) through their son Nathanial Gallup (1629-1675). Emeline's mother, Laura Pease, was a descendant of Christopher Pease (1719-1794) of Martha's Vineyard, Connecticut, and his wife (last name Hill) of Lebanon, Connecticut. Emeline never married. She died in 1901 and is buried in Quechee Cemetery, Windsor County, Vermont, with many other members of the Gallup/Pease family.

Extent: 1 file; approximately 20 pages

Scope and Content: The collection includes various family Bible records and histories of the Gallup and Pease families of Vermont and Connecticut. The majority of these records were compiled and written by Emeline Gallup (1816-1901) of Windsor County, Vermont. This branch of the Gallup family is descended from John Gallup (1593-1650) and Christobel Brushett (1592-1655). The Pease family is descended from James Pease, who immigrated from England to Martha's Vineyard, Connecticut, in 1642.

Emeline also documented the later Richardson branch of the Gallup family, those descended from or related to Mariah H. Gallup (1817-1872), Emeline's sister, and Lester Richardson (1805-1892). There are also several newspaper clippings and a letter pertaining to the Gallup and Richardson family in the mid-20th century.

Provenance: Donor not listed in file.
