Biography of Creator(s): Pat was born in Worth Township, Similac County, Michigan on June 23; 1925 to William Thomas D'Arcy of St. Clair County, Michigan and Ethel Rosalie Phelps of Harts Grove, Ashtabula County, Ohio. Pat's early education was at Pleasant Ridge and Ferndale Schools and Lincoln High at Ferndale, Michigan. She attended Hillsdale College; Hillsdale; MI. In 1947, she married N. Clifford Osborne, known as "Ozzie," a WWII veteran. A son and daughter were born to them.

Pat Osborne was a documented direct descendant of Charlemagne, Mayflower passengers, Magna Carta participants, and Revolutionary War patriots. She was also a member of the Colonial Dames, First Families of Ohio, and the Wing Family of America. For many years, Pat was a dedicated genealogist working on her own research and that of others. Living in Florida, she was a member of the Lehigh Acres Genealogical Society and served as President. She also was a member of the Charlotte County Genealogical Society. She was always interested in her family history but began her serious research when she joined the Lehigh Acres (FL) Genealogical Society. She passed away in 2002 in Florida.

Custodial History: The collection was originally donated to the Lee County (FL) Genealogical Society by the Osborne family.

Scope and Content: This collection consists of Osborne's genealogical research files, arranged by surname. The research was done prior to the advent of computer genealogical resources. It

includes family group sheets (with citations), copies of court records and birth and death certificates, and records from family Bibles. The major families are from Wood, Seneca, and Ashtabula Counties, Ohio.
