Biographies of Creators: Robert Thompson Secrest was the son of Ralph Waits Secrest (1880-1929) and Amelia Howard Thompson (1879-1947). In 1929 he married Virginia Belle "Dutch" Bowden (18 Feb 1911-10 Aug 1990) while she was a senior at Senecaville High School. They had three children and ten grandchildren.

The following biography was taken from "Souvenir Booklet of Historical Facts and Stories: Village of Senecaville Sesqui-Centennial Celebration. 1815-1965," sponsored by the Senecaville Home and School Association and Senecaville Volunteer Fire department; page 25:

"Bob", as he is known to most of us, was born in Greenwood, the son of the late Ralph and Amelia Thompson Secrest. He graduated from Senecaville High School and Muskingum College. He taught school in Senecaville and Cambridge and was Superintendent of schools in Murray City when he ran for State Legislature in 1930. He was elected to and served in the State Legislature from 1930-1932.

He was elected to Congress from the 15th district in 1932 and served in that capacity until 1942. World War II broke out and he resigned his office to enter the service, being the first

Congressman to do so. He entered the U.S. Navy as a Lt. Commander and served on Adm. Nimitz staff in the Pacific.

After World War II, in 1946, he ran for reelection to Congress from the 15th district and was defeated. From 1946 to 1948 he worked in the Library of Congress as a law assistant.

He was reelected in 1948 to Congress from the 15th district where he remained until 1954. At that time, he was appointed by President Eisenhower to the Federal Trade Commission for a period of 7 years. In 1961 he returned to Ohio as the State Commerce Director under Governor DiSalle.

Bob was reelected to Congress from the 15th district and is presently [1965] serving. At the end of this term, the 15th district will be abolished.

Bob is married to the former Virginia Bowden. They have children and 10 grandchildren.

Scope and Content: Photographs from the political career and personal life of Robert Thompson Secrest (1904-1994), US Congressman. He was born on a farm near Senecaville, Guernsey County, Ohio, and went on to serve his native state as a member of the United States Congress from 1933 to 1942, from 1949 to 1954 and again from 1963 to 1966. He graduated from Muskingum College, Washington, D.C. College of Law, Columbia University, and the British School of Civil Affairs. He served in the United States Navy being the first member of Congress to resign his seat in order to join the armed forces during World War II. His military experiences took him to England, Africa, Italy, and the Pacific. From 1946 to 1947 he was a legal supervisor for the Library of Congress. The Democrat was a member of the Federal Trade Commission from 1954 to 1961, Director of Commerce for the State of Ohio in 1962, and a member of the Ohio State senate from 1969 to 1973. After retirement, the Secrests lived at 7122 Bloomfield Road, Cambridge, Ohio.

The collection was purchased at the public sale by John Sutter of Lucas, Ohio, who in turn donated the collection to the Ohio Genealogical Society on February 23, 2021.
