Biography of creators: Excerpt from *History of Morgan County with Portraits and Biographical Sketches of Some of Its Pioneers and Prominent Men* by Charles Robertson, 1886 (pages 353-4):

“Edwin Sherwood, son of the venerable William Sherwood, is a well-known citizen and leading farmer of Morgan County. He is a native of county, having been born in Malta Township, November 28, 1823. Reared in the then new country, he had only the advantages of for education afforded by the inferior schools of that period... In 1852, the salt industry being dull, he went to California, where he remained for two years... In 1854 he returned and purchased his father’s interest the salt works... He was married June 2, 1843 to Margaret G. Simpson, daughter of David Simpson... Mr. and Mrs. Sherwood have six children—Arthur L., William, Eva (Lovell), Charles W., Oscar T. and Edwin M.” *Note: Edwin’s parents, William and Rachel, are also featured in this edition of the history of Morgan County, Ohio.*

Edwin remarried after Margaret’s death in 1896 to her niece, Elizabeth Luella “Lulu” or “Lula” Zellers (sometimes spelled as “Zellars”), who was forty years younger than he was. Judging from their letters in the collection, Elizabeth Luella was close with the family throughout her life and, as an adult, helped them with the household after Margaret’s death. Edwin and Elizabeth Luella had one daughter together, Luella E. Sherwood. Elizabeth and Luella moved to Etna Township, Licking County after Edwin’s death in 1909, where Luella would graduate from Etna School District, Licking County. Luella married James Hupp (1891-1976) in 1918. They moved to New York briefly (as evidenced by letters) before permanently settling in West Virginia. Luella and James are buried in Buckhannon Memorial Cemetery, Buckhannon, Upshur County, West Virginia, USA. The rest of the Sherwood family is buried in McConnelsville Cemetery, McConnelsville, Morgan County, Ohio, USA. Many graves and obituaries for the family are on FindAGrave.com.

Custodial History: The collection was previously held by Ohio History Connection. Their staff had started processing the collection before its donation to OGS. As of September 2022, the Hupp family descendants are still in possession of additional family items, including Edwin Sr.’s diary of his time in California and additional photographs.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of letters between Sherwood, Simpson, and Zellers family members and their friends, with years ranging from 1830 to about 1930. Most letters are dated and signed and paired with the original envelope. Additional items include family photographs, various ledgers, schoolbooks, wills, calling cards, invitations, and business records, dated 1870s-1930.

Letters discuss family matters and daily life, including the struggles of Arthur Sherwood and his son Clyde (found in letters to Edwin Sherwood Sr.) and the letters from “Vida” (likely Savannah *Pedicord* Sherwood) detailing Oscar T. Sherwood’s illness (writing to Edwin Sherwood Sr. and his wife). Some of Edwin and Margaret’s grandchildren, nieces, and nephews moved west to Wisconsin and Illinois, and their letters discuss their travels and experiences in their new home states. E. H. Zellers, Elizabeth Luella Sherwood’s nephew, was enlisted in the army during World

War I, and he writes letters to his aunt and cousin about his time in basic training and then abroad (Files 29-30).

Oversized materials include: large unattached letters (these are older, and generally from Simpson family members writing to Edwin Sr. and Margaret Sherwood), original wills, deeds, contracts, and certificates from the family, as well as a business ledger from Oscar T. Sherwood's legal practice (carbon copies of his letters to clients), and Edwin Sherwood's school book, circa 1837.

Arrangement Note: The collection was initially processed by OHC staff, so the original order is unknown (a description of their arrangement can be found in File 0). The collection was processed again and reorganized by the OGS archivist. Boxes 1-2 are arranged by generation, starting with oldest to youngest, then sorted by individual family member. Within each folder, the letters are organized chronologically by month/year. The first 2 folders in Box 1 represent vital statistics on the family such as death notices, letters informing of a death in the extended family, obituaries, and records pertaining to the settling of the estates. This type of information can also be found in Box 3 in calling cards and invitations for marriages and anniversary dinners.

Unattached letters or letters with unidentified senders/recipients are filed separately so to avoid misidentification (Box 3). Oversized letters and legal documents (wills and deeds) were placed in Box 4 so they would not remain folded.

Extent: 4 boxes (3 standard, 1 oversized flat).

Access: No access restrictions.

Language: English.

Provenance: The collection was originally donated to Ohio History Connection in 2016 by the Hupp family descendants in Syracuse, New York. OHC donated the collection to OGS in 2021.

H.” is likely Edward Harmon Zellers, son of Charles Edward Zellers and Dora *Weaver* Zellers (See: "Ohio, World War I, Enrollment Cards, 1914-1918," database, FamilySearch (<https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/3:1:3Q9M-C33W-SQGN-L?cc=3029263> : 22 September 2019), > image 1 of 1; Ohio State Archives, Columbus). Additional letters are from Germany, one contains a piece of cloth cut from a German airplane, potentially a Fokker D. VII painted in the style of Lt. File 49: Edwin Sherwood "Class Leader's Record" books, 1883 and 1893. Title page in the 1893 volume reads "For the use of Class-Leaders in the Methodist Episcopal Church." Each book contains the attendance information for that class (gives first and last name of student). Includes some of Edwin's grandchildren and extended family members. Some attendees are noted as "Deceased" and include a death date, if applicable.

File 50: Photographs, 1890s-1910s. Most people are unidentified. Family reunion/group photos and some school photos. Among the labeled photos are: "Etna Public Schools, Luella Sherwood, Taken 1912"; "One room school at Sherwoodsborg, Allie and Nellie"; "Etna Public Schools, Luella Sherwood, Eighth Grade: Lloyd Mason?; Harrison Stalter; Mr. Rickey (teacher); Grayden Shaver; Lothe Snider?; Luella; ? Potts; Lydia Syndia; Helen Gierhart; Maria Snider; Mr. Forrest (Principle), Lucinda Palmer."

- 1899, transfer of land in West Virginia for "oil and gas purposes" from Edwin Sherwood to A. D. Scott, Carter Oil Company.
